

Two for you!

Play with the pieces and create a pair of perfectly pieced projects.

Tumble into a sewing machine table topper or craft a delightful daisy design ideal for centre of small quilt. Explore the potential of some fabulous dies and combine to make two diversely different designs.



Machine Table Topper (Finished size 52 x 40cm / 21 x 16")

You need:

Gemini Multi Media Patchwork Tumbler Die
Gemini - Multi Media Fabric Strips Die
Gemini Multi Media Patchwork Orange Peel Die (optional)
Threaders Erasable Fabric Pens
Crafter's Companion Stick and Spray for Fabric

Fabric:

0.5m John Louden 100% Cotton Blender Fabric - Lilac
0.5m John Louden 100% Cotton Blender Fabric - Aqua
55 x 42cm/22 x 17" Wadding

Cut

55 x 42cm/22 x 17" Aqua (backing fabric)

42 x 18cm/16.5 x 7" Lilac

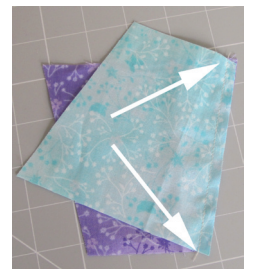


1. Use 4.6" die, cut thirteen Lilac and twelve Aqua Tumbler shapes.

2. Sew three Lilac and two Aqua shapes to make a row. Repeat twice more making three rows in total. Press seams open.

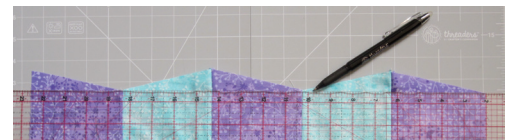
3. Sew two Lilac and three Aqua to make a second row. Repeat making two rows in total - repeat once.

Tip: Align the Tumbler shapes so they cross over on the seam allowance.

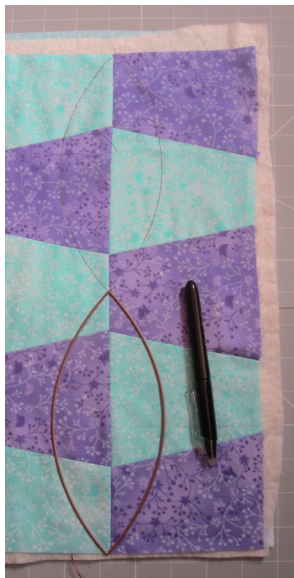


4. Join all five rows together.

5. Trim sides level: using erasable pen, draw line along edge before trimming.



6. Layer trimmed top with wadding and Aqua backing fabric. Hold layers together with Stick and Spray. (Remember to spray in well ventilated surroundings and spray lightly as per instructions.)



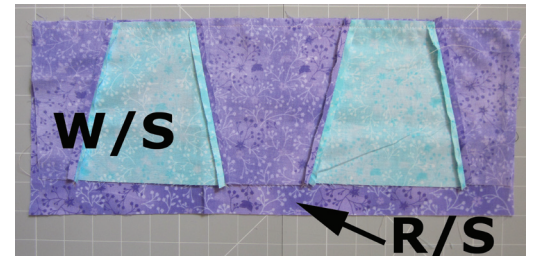
7. Create a simple quilting design by drawing round 7.7" Orange Peel die - use erasable pen. Attach walking foot to machine, sew along lines, remove lines afterwards.

Make Pocket

1. Use 5.6 Tumbler die: Cut three Lilac and two Aqua. Join together in a row.

2. Place on quilted panel and trim to fit.

3. After trimming, lay strip on 42 x 18cm/16.5 x 7" Lilac. Stitch long sides (R/S together). Fold Lilac strip over and press carefully allowing a small section of Lilac to appear as a trim to the pocket - see picture.



4. Place pocket on one end of quilted panel, sew in place. Keep stitching close to raw edge of quilted panel.

5. Draw line in centre of pocket, sew drawn line.

6. Cut 74 x 2" Lilac (join where necessary). Bind using preferred binding technique.



Daisy Design (Finished size 80cm/32" square)

You need:

Gemini Multi Media Patchwork Orange Peel
 Gemini Multi Media Patchwork Dresden Die
 Gemini - Multi Media Fabric Strips Die
 Crafter's Companion Stick and Stay for Fabric

Fabric:

0.5m John Louden 100% Cotton Blender Fabric - Olive
 0.5m John Louden 100% Cotton Blender Fabric - Black
 0.5m John Louden 100% Cotton Blender Fabric - Orange
 0.5m John Louden 100% Cotton Blender Fabric - Ivory
 85cm/34" square Wadding and Backing Fabrics



Cut:
 14" square Ivory
 Eight 4.9" Orange Peel shapes Orange
 Four 3.5" Orange Peel shapes Orange
 Sixteen 3.5" Orange Peel shapes Green
 Four 6.5" squares Ivory (Build a Block)
 Four 14 x 2.5" strips Black
 Four 14 x 4.5" strips Ivory
 Two 26 x 4" strips Black
 Two 33 x 4" strips Black



1. Press 14" Ivory square diagonally and from side to side .

2. Spray small amount of Stick and Stay on W/S of all Orange Peel shapes.

3. Place four 4.9" Orange sections on 14" Ivory square, aligning with pressed lines. Place remaining four on diagonals. Do not press in place YET!



4. Tuck eight Green shapes under Orange sections. Press all pieces in place.

5. Satin/buttonhole/applique stitch over raw edge of Green shapes and in centre where orange shapes overlap.

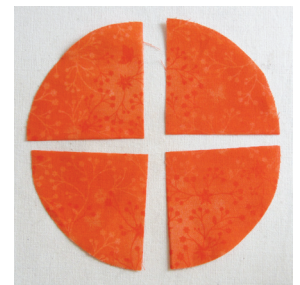
6. Repeat stitching on remaining raw edges

7. Use Dresden die: Cut twenty 4.04" Green

8. Fold each piece in half, sew across short end, turn R/S out, poke point out gently, press.

9. Join five sections together to make a fan and place on 6.5" Ivory square.

10. Use Dresden circle die: Cut one Orange circle, divide in four.



11. Cover base of fan with Orange quarter circle. Sew raw edge in place and also sew round top of fan - buttonhole/applique stitch is good choice.

12. Join one 14 x 2.5" strip Black to one 14 x 4.5" Ivory to make wide band. Repeat three more times.





13. Lay out the various sections and join together to make square.

14. Arrange remaining Orange Peel shapes on the border. Press then satin/buttonhole/applique stitch raw edges.



15. Attach 26 x 4" Black strips to opposite sides then attach 33 x 4" strips to the other two sides.



16. Lay quilt top on wadding and backing fabric. Baste/tack layers using Stick and Spray. Cut 2" Green strips for binding. Bind in preferred fashion.

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
